BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The practice of applied behavior analysis in Alabama is declared to affect the public health, safety, and welfare and to be subject to regulation to protect the public from the practice of applied behavior analysis by unqualified persons and from unprofessional conduct by persons licensed to practice applied behavior analysis.

Section 2. (1) CERTIFYING BOARD. The nationally accredited Behavior Analyst Certification Board, or its successor.

- (2) LICENSED ASSISTANT BEHAVIOR ANALYST. An individual who is certified by the certifying board as an assistant behavior analyst and satisfies the criteria specified in this act. A licensed assistant behavior analysts is required to work under the supervision of a licensed behavior analyst.
- (3) LICENSED BEHAVIOR ANALYST. An individual who is certified by the certifying board as a behavior analyst and satisfies the criteria specified in this act.

(4) LICENSING BOARD. The Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board.

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(5) PRACTICE OF BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS. The design, implementation, and evaluation of instructional and environmental modifications by a behavior analyst to produce socially significant improvements in human behavior. The practice of behavior analysis includes the empirical identification of functional relations between behavior and environmental factors, known as functional assessment and analysis. Applied behavior analysis interventions are based on scientific research and the direct observation and measurement of behavior and environment. They utilize contextual factors, establishing operations, antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement, and other consequences to help people develop new behaviors, increase or decrease existing behaviors, and emit behaviors under specific environmental conditions. The practice of behavior analysis expressly excludes psychological testing, neuropsychology, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, and long-term counseling as treatment modalities.

Section 3. (a) Each person desiring to obtain a license as a licensed behavior analyst shall make application to the licensing board upon such form and in such manner as the licensing board shall prescribe and shall furnish evidence to the licensing board that the person satisfies all of the following qualifications:

1 (1) Is of good moral character.

- (2) Has passed the examination and is certified as a board certified behavior analyst by the certifying board.
 - (3) Maintains active status and fulfills all requirements for renewal and recertification with the certifying board as a board certified behavior analyst.
 - (4) Conducts his or her professional activities in accordance with accepted standards, including the Guidelines for Responsible Conduct for Behavior Analysts and the professional disciplinary and ethical standards of the certifying board.
 - (5) Has not been subject to disciplinary suspension or revocation by the certifying board for violation of the professional disciplinary and ethical standards.
 - (b) Each person desiring to obtain a license as a licensed assistant behavior analyst shall make application to the licensing board upon such form and in such manner as the licensing board shall prescribe and shall furnish evidence to the licensing board that the person:
 - (1) Is of good moral character.
 - (2) Has passed the examination and is certified as a board certified assistant behavior analyst by the certifying board.
- (3) Maintains active status and fulfills all requirements for renewal and recertification with the

certifying board as a board certified assistant behavior
analyst.

- (4) Conducts his or her professional activities in accordance with accepted standards, including the Guidelines for Responsible Conduct and the professional disciplinary and ethical standards of the certifying board.
- (5) Has not been subject to disciplinary suspension or revocation by the certifying board for violation of the professional disciplinary and ethical standards.
- (6) Is supervised by a licensed behavior analyst in a manner consistent with the requirements of the certifying board for supervision of board certified assistant behavior analysts.
- Section 4. (a) No person shall hold himself or herself out to be a licensed behavior analyst or a licensed assistant behavior analyst unless he or she is certified by the certifying board and satisfies the applicable requirements of this section. Violation of this subsection shall be punishable by a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) or by the suspension or loss of any license held by the violator, or both.
- (b) No person shall practice applied behavior analysis unless he or she is certified by the certifying board or is a licensed behavior analyst or a licensed assistant behavior analyst working under the supervision of a licensed behavior analyst. Violation of this subsection shall be

punishable by a fine of not more than two hundred fifty
dollars (\$250) or by the suspension or loss of any license
held by the violator, or both.

- (c) This section may not be construed as prohibiting or restricting the practice of any of the following:
 - (1) An applied behavior analysis direct contact therapist acting only under the extended authority and direction of a licensed behavior analyst or a licensed assistant behavior analyst to provide applied behavior analysis services.
 - analyst, so long as the licensed professional does not represent that he or she is a behavior analyst or qualified to provide applied behavior analysis, and so long as the services of the licensed professional are specified within the scope of practice of the licensing law governing the licensed professional and the services performed are commensurate with the formal university training and supervised experience of the licensed professional.
 - Section 5. (a) The Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board is created.
 - (b) The licensing board shall consist of three licensed behavior analysts, one licensed assistant behavior analyst, and one consumer representative holding neither license, all appointed by the Governor, and who are free from conflicts of interest in performing the duties of the

licensing board. The membership of the licensing board shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.

- (c) The licensing board may license as licensed behavior analysts and licensed assistant behavior analysts those persons who satisfy the requirements for licensure as specified in Section 3, and may charge reasonable fees for licenses.
- (d) The licensing board may promulgate, develop, and enforce disciplinary rules and regulations adopted pursuant to the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act, and may coordinate investigations with the process used by the certifying board for investigating alleged violations of the professional disciplinary and ethical standards of the certifying board.

Section 6. The licensing board shall issue a license to any person who satisfies all of the following:

- (1) Holds a valid behavior analyst license from another state.
 - (2) Is currently certified by the certifying board.
- (3) Satisfies the requirements specified in this act and any licensing requirements contained in administrative rules promulgated by the licensing board.
 - (4) Has no imposed or pending disciplinary action.

Section 7. The licensing board shall be subject to the Alabama Sunset Law, Chapter 20, Title 41, Code of Alabama 1975, as an enumerated agency as provided in Section 41-20-3,

Code of Alabama 1975, and shall have a termination date of

October 1, 2015, and every four years thereafter, unless

continued pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law.

Section 8. This act shall become effective on the

first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
