BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. A reservation of mineral rights in real property made or contracted for on or after the effective date of this act shall expire within 30 years from the date of the reservation unless the severance or extraction of the minerals has been commenced prior to the expiration of the right.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
